

## BRANISLAV ANDJELIĆ

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### PERSONAL PROFILE

Mr. Andjelić is involved in strategic Information Society and Knowledge Economy issues on both the national and international level. He has been an advisor to the former Prime Minister Zoran Djindjić and the first director of the e-Government program for the Republic of Serbia. He is a member of the United Nations ICT Task Force working group on National and Regional e-Strategies, e-Envoy for Serbia and Montenegro, and the Advisor to the Chair of the Stability Pact's "eSEEurope Initiative". He is listed as an international expert for UNDP on the subject of Information Society and Knowledge Economy.

Mr. Andjelić is also involved in the strategic national security issues, particularly in the 4C+I area (command, control, communication, computers and intelligence). He is currently part of the team formulating National Data Protection Policy for the Republic of Serbia. He is a member of the board of the Atlantic Council for Serbia and Montenegro.

Mr. Andjelić has been involved in media both as a reporter and as an editor and media outlet owner. He has worked in the conflict situations in East Africa and the Middle East. He is the founder of the largest electronic news service from the Balkans, the only Internet media outlet member of the South East Europe Media Organization. He is a member of the International Press Institute in Vienna.

Mr. Andjelić is the founder of a charitable non-profit organization that delivered hundreds of tons of clothing, food and medical supplies to the refugees in the Balkans and organized medical air-lift for wounded children to be treated in the hospitals in the United States. He is also one of the founders of the St.Sava Serbian Orthodox Church of Boston.

Mr. Andjelić was trained as a journalist at the University of Belgrade and an economist at the University of the District of Columbia in Washington, D.C. where he graduated at the top of his class (GPA 4.0). Over the years he received training in project and change management, corporate restructuring and organization, information architecture and management, and technical IT fields from various professional organizations and associations.

Mr. Andjelić was born in 1959 in Belgrade, where he returned to live in 2000 after 20 years of living and working in Canada, United States, Africa and the Middle East. He is the president of Allston Systems Inc, a high-technology company in Boston, Massachusetts and president of the Yugoslav Productivity Institute in Belgrade. He has business interests in several oil and chemical, communications and media companies in the United States, Canada and Serbia.
